	Through the National Environmental Science Program's Marine Biodiversity Hub, we have invested \$400,000 in the Clean Ocean Foundation's National Outfall Database project to address the need of government and community to understand the impacts on the health of the ocean environment that occur from sewerage outfalls around Australia.
	The Morrison Government encourages state and territory governments, who have responsibility for wastewater and its impacts on coastal water quality, to use the information gathered through the National Outfall Database project to better plan for wastewater infrastructure, and inform decision making that will benefit the community and the marine environment. We will continue to work with the Clean Ocean Foundation on how best to support the continuation of its great work.
